

MISSION AND PURPOSE STATEMENT

TOMAH BAPTIST ACADEMY exists to assist Independent Baptist families with the mental, physical, spiritual and social development of their children by providing an affordable, safe, Bible-centered education (Luke 2:52)

ADMISSIONS POLICY

- 1. Children who are members or faithful attendees of Independent Baptist Churches, or who are the children of parents who are members or faithful attendees of Independent Baptist churches will be given first priority in admission to the school.
- 2. If the Administration finds it necessary to limit the number of students at any grade level, first priority will be given to regularly attending families of Tomah Baptist Church.
- 3. A child who is not a member or a faithful attendee of an Independent Baptist church, or whose parents are not, should be a member of a family which is in active fellowship with a Bible-believing, evangelical church with at least one of the parents regularly attending and serving there.
- 4. The parents of prospective students must state, in writing, that they have read and agree with the Statement of Faith of the school, and both parents must agree, in writing to have their children educated in accordance with it.
- 5. The parents of prospective students must state, in writing, that:
 - a. The school has full discretion in the discipline of their children while at school and school activities, within the bounds of the Discipline Policy.
 - b. The school has full discretion for the grade placement of their children.
 - c. They will meet all tuition, fees, and other financial obligations to the school.
 - d. That they have read, agree with, and will perform the responsibilities of the Parents' Code.
- 6. All prospective students will be given a diagnostic test to determine grade placement and to determine if the prospective students fits the educational capabilities of the school.
- 7. The Principal and/or Administration must interview all prospective parents and students. The Administration has final determination in the admissibility of a student to the school.
- 8. The Administration may refuse to admit a student with a history of academic, disciplinary, or psychological problems.
- 9. Rejection of applications will be by written notification.
- 10. TOMAH BAPTIST ACADEMY does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, physical disability, national or ethnic origin in the administration of any of its policies or programs.

11. In order to comply with state regulations, each year the school requires that all children entering school for the first time in kindergarten, and those entering 6th or 11th grades, be examined by the family physician before school opens. Health records are transferred with scholastic records when the children change schools.
